## What is the intended benefit of the rule?

Chapters 280 and 282 describe the Department's interpretation of the underlying statutes to help the public understand and reduce the uncertainty about what is subject to use tax and what is exempt.

To the extent rules are being rescinded, the Department determined those rules were unnecessary or obsolete. The Department has determined that Chapter 280 is no longer necessary. Two rules will be amended for clarity and to remove obsolete and unnecessary language and re-promulgated into Chapter 282 where the subject matters of those rules more closely align. Chapter 282 has been revised where possible to rescind statutory text or obsolete and unnecessary language. The rules that will be re-promulgated have been determined to be necessary.

- 282.8 is amended to remove unnecessary and outdated language.
- 282.9 is amended to remove outdated, unnecessary, and duplicative statutory language.
- 282.10 is amended to remove outdated, unnecessary, and duplicative statutory language.
